A Message from Mayor Bernie Platt: Shared service agreements are the key to saving tax dollars



Throughout my tenure as Mayor, I've often spoken about the need to tighten our municipal belt; to streamline the services we deliver, and the way we deliver them.

In the last year, Cherry Hill has made unprecedented strides in that arena. We have revolutionized the way we do business - most notably in the area of trash services. Our efforts gained speed last October, when my administration launched the first phase of a two-step plan to reduce our costs for trash collection and disposal.

Here in Cherry Hill, trash collection and disposal are handled under two separate agreements. In total, trash services cost the Township about \$7.3 million a year - more than 10 percent of Cherry Hill's total operating budget. Trash collection alone accounts for roughly \$6 million a year. That is a tremendous expense, but one that funds a critical municipal service.

Standing beside elected officials from Gloucester Township and Merchantville more than six months ago, I announced a landmark effort between our municipalities that we hoped and believed would shave millions of dollars from those costs.

Our three communities, along with the Cherry Hill Fire Department and School District, formed the largest joint-purchasing effort in our region - taking our collective business out onto the open market to seek a new contract for trash collection.

The premise of this deal was simple: To harness our collective purchasing power to obtain a lower cost for our taxpayers than we had ever seen in the past.

To provide some perspective on the scale of that collective trash-collection operation: Our three municipalities deliver trash-collection services to more than 40,000 single-family homes each week.

In Cherry Hill alone, we serve 22,422 homes, as well as handling trash collection for the School District and Fire Department - the result of a separate shared-services pact. And in 2009 alone, our three towns collected a total of 56,779 tons of residential solid waste.

In the end, our experiment turned out to be a huge success, yielding about \$2 million in savings for Cherry Hill alone over the course of the next five years.

Based on that success, we have again come together - this time, adding Voorhees and Collingswood into the mix - and are forging ahead with the second phase of our plan, seeking a new deal for our trash-disposal costs.

This is a bigger, stronger alliance: Together, our five municipalities account for about one-third of Camden County's total population and single-family homes.

Our towns span more than 60 square miles; we serve nearly 185,000 residents, and more than 67,000 households.

That is a lot of business - and this joint effort sends a clear message to vendors:

If you want that business, you'd better bring down our costs,

Under the current pricing structure, Cherry Hill pays about \$1.3 million in incinerator fees each year to dispose of approximately 23,000 tons of solid waste. We believe this deal could reduce that dollar amount by up to \$250,000 a year.

And if one accounts for annual rate increases of about \$1 per ton, by the end of a five-year contract, that savings should prove to be much greater.

It's the Township's latest effort to streamline municipal services while saving significant taxpayer money, and I expected to begin realizing that savings this summer.

Time and again over the last several years, I've shared Cherry Hill's efforts toward sharing services and combining resources. But this dual-phase trash plan is the biggest such effort we have ever undertaken. In that same vein, though, it is worth noting that we continue looking to the future - and we've timed both our collection and disposal contracts so they will expire at the same time, giving us the option five years from now of further trash service consolidation.

Cherry Hill and our partners have remained ahead of the curve in cutting costs without sacrificing service. In that regard, I'm thankful to Mayor David Mayer in Gloucester Township, Mayor Michael Mignogna in Voorhees, Mayor Jim Maley in Collingswood, and Mayor Frank North in Merchantville, for their continued willingness to work toward progress.

My administration has stayed ahead of the curve in cutting costs without cutting services, and as we move ahead in this process, I hope to work with other communities to standardize purchasing across the board to harness that purchasing power and recognize even greater savings.

It's been said many times: Government simply cannot continue operating under the old way of doing business, and I believe in leading by example. Truly, I believe Cherry Hill and its partners in this effort have done just that, by working together to get real results for our taxpayers.

Township Council approves updated Green Action Plan, SCH supports efforts

Cherry Hill is looking to the future, with the March 28 adoption of a new Green Action Plan - the renewal of a plan that three years ago helped the Township set the standard for sustainability statewide.

The original plan, implemented in March of 2008, set 10 ambitious goals aimed at implementing environmentally sound operations at Town Hall while reducing spending. Among those goals were the completion of an energy audit and related upgrades at the Municipal Building; the implementation of the RecycleBank program; and the installation of solar panels at the Department of Public Works and Town Hall.

With those goals nearing completion and the plan's three-year anniversary approaching, Mayor Platt felt it necessary to draft a new plan reflecting the progress made and setting new goals for the months and years to come.

"The original Green Action Plan put Cherry Hill on the map for sustainability," Mayor Platt said. "You can see it all around our community - in the rooftop solar panels at DPW; the big blue RecycleBank cans that line our streets; the hybrid SUVs at Town Hall. It's evident in the LED lights recently installed in the township Community Center, and in other common-sense changes we've implemented, such as reducing our paper consumption."

We have met and surpassed most of the goals identified in the original Green Action Plan, and many others that stemmed from those ideas.

"Perhaps most importantly, we've saved real, quantifiable tax dollars," he added.



On Monday, March 28, Mayor Platt and Council honored the volunteers from Sustainable Cherry Hill for their continued support of the Township's environmental initiatives.

Platt noted that the RecycleBank program alone has saved the Township more than \$1.5 million in landfill and incinerator costs. The solar panels are expected to offset 30 percent of the total energy usage at Public Works, while generating an additional \$50,000 annually in sellable credits.

"The switch to hybrids has cut down on fuel and maintenance costs for the municipal fleet; lighting efficiencies have cut down on not just energy usage, but on maintenance and replacement costs, as well. And these are just a few ways we've tightened our belt while shrinking our carbon footprint," he added.

"But while I am so proud of all our community has accomplished, I realize that there is much more to be done; that is what this new plan is all about."

The Platt administration's new plan establishes 10 new goals:

1. Completing energy audits at the Department of Public Works and the Cherry Hill Library and implementing the recommended efficiencies.

2. Continued energy efficiency improvements at all township buildings - including the completion of the solar array at Town Hall later this year.
3. With Sustainable Cherry Hill, continuing community outreach and education.
4. Work with community organizations to educate residents and businesses about waste reduction and help implement innovative solutions to reduce waste.
5. Establishing a program to recognize local businesses that have adopted sustainability into their business model.
6. Adopting a green purchasing policy to expand the purchase of green products where financially feasible and equally effective as the current products used.
7. Continuing to improve the municipal fleet through the implementation of an advanced management system and expanding the inventory of alternative-fuel vehicles used.
8. Implementing resource-saving policies in Town Hall related to lighting, heating, cooling, and operation of office equipment.
9. Continuing to improve the safety of and access to bike and pedestrian facilities across the Township to encourage the use of non-motorized transportation.
10. Promoting organized community clean-ups of public open spaces.

"The original Green Action Plan was a landmark environmental plan that set the standard for Cherry Hill and other government agencies around New Jersey," Platt said. "I am amazed by the progress our community has made in the last three years - of all our community has accomplished over these last three years, and I look forward to the progress we now look toward."

Mayor Platt honors 13-year-old girl's life-saving generosity

When Cherry Hill resident Hannah Kahn was in first grade, she was diagnosed with a heart problem. Within a week of her diagnosis, the principal at her school had installed an Automated External Defibrillator - a device that would have been used to save Hannah's life had she gone into cardiac arrest.

At the time, defibrillators were not widely available in public buildings. The school's willingness to act quickly to ensure her safety deeply affected Hannah, who is now 13. She knew she wanted to give back some day.

This past November, when Hannah celebrated her Bat Mitzvah, she finally got the chance. She decided to donate some of the gift money she'd received to the Township for the purchase of a defibrillator to be installed at the Croft Farm Arts Center.

In all, Hannah donated \$1,000 toward the device's purchase. Virtua Hospital contributed an additional \$500, acquired the

Arts Center for a special ceremony to honor their generosity and officially dedicate the device.



"Croft Farm plays host to activities year-round that are attended by hundreds of people of all ages," Mayor Platt said. "I am extremely grateful to everyone involved in this effort."

Platt noted that the machine would help ensure the health and safety of all Arts Center visitors and could, potentially, save a life.

"Hannah is a remarkable young woman who turned her memories of a life-changing event into a gift that could help change - or save - another person's life," Platt said. "It was my pleasure to honor her for her generosity."

Cherry Hill joins NJDOT bike/pedestrian safety program

Cherry Hill has been selected to participate in a state program that offers assistance to municipalities in developing a comprehensive plan for bicycle and pedestrian safety enhancements in their communities.

Over the next several months, the Township's community planners will work with the DOT's Office of Bicycle and Pedestrian Programs and an appointed consultant to pinpoint the Township's outstanding needs and potential improvements, and then put together a plan for implementation.

"As a resident of this town for more than 45 years, I've watched Cherry Hill transform itself from a sleepy, rural community into the bustling suburban hub it is today," Mayor Bernie Platt said. "But that growth has brought with it traffic congestion, and roads that were designed decades ago solely with cars in mind."

Nevertheless, Platt noted, countless Cherry Hill residents and daily commuters enjoy biking and walking, and other non-motorized forms of transportation are growing in popularity with each day.

"And that is where this program will be immensely useful to our community," Platt said. "I'm hopeful it will give us the tools to

craft a plan that makes it safer and easier for everyone to navigate the community."

As part of the program, the Township will explore a number of issues, including safety near schools; improving access to public transportation; pinpointing and clearly labeling the ideal locations for biking and walking; and increasing the public's knowledge of pedestrian and bicycle safety education.

Incorporating bike/ped safety into the Township's Master Plan will complement the array of other safety improvements and traffic-calming measures undertaken in recent years.

In 2010 alone, Cherry Hill installed or upgraded about 4,500 linear feet of pedestrian crosswalks, posted "Share the Road" signs, and installed bicycle-safe sewer grates on roads frequently used by cyclists, including Kresson Road. Additionally, Cherry Hill Police have posted electronic speed boards on several streets in an effort to curb speeding, and plans are in place to increase the number of traffic-calming devices in use throughout town.

Platt added that any enhancements to bike and pedestrian mobility are in keeping with the Township's ongoing sustainability

efforts and ambitious 10-point Green Action Plan.

In fact, the Township has already begun to enlist the help of Sustainable Cherry Hill and its "Way to Go" bicycle/pedestrian safety committee for suggestions and feedback on possible improvements.

"Our ultimate goal is to make Cherry Hill a safe and sustainable community," Platt said. "We have made a great deal of progress on this front during my administration, but there is always more work to be done. I'm confident this plan will allow our community to remain proactive in continuing to address the community's needs as we move into the future."

Cherry Hill Township, Fire Department unveil plans for permanent 9/11 Memorial

"On September 11, 2001, our country was forever changed," Platt said. "It is a day we will surely never forget, and for a while now, the Township and our emergency responders have been searching for a fitting way to permanently pay tribute here in Cherry Hill.

The CHFD has led the way in designing the monument, which will sit in front of the Fire Administration Building at 1100 Marlkrass Road, where it will remain visible to the public for many years to come.

Holy Eucharist Church Youth Group cleans up open spaces

On March 19, members of the Holy Eucharist Church Youth Group volunteered their afternoon cleaning up a parcel of open space at Kresson and Brace roads as part of their annual Lenten Retreat. In the span of about 2 hours, some 25 young men and women collected about a dozen trash bags full of plastic bags, papers, bottles, and other trash and debris that had littered the community's landscape.



Mayor Platt and Council honored the youth group and its coordinator, Gina Winters, with a special proclamation at the April 11 Town Council meeting.

The group volunteered its time again in a similar effort at Croft Farm on April 16, as part of Cherry Hill's town-wide Green Volunteer Day.

At the heart of the piece will be a steel beam from the World Trade Center's North Tower; it will sit between two granite "towers" anchored in a Pentagon-shaped granite base.

"The steel symbolizes strength, of course," Platt said. "But by that same token, the fact that those majestic towers have been reduced to just these small, mangled, distressed pieces of metal speaks to the tremendous loss our nation suffered on that day."

The granite-and-steel memorial will stand in the middle of a larger courtyard also to be constructed. Platt said the garden will provide fitting solitude for those who come to pay their respects in the future.

To make this memorial a reality in time for the anniversary this September, Township officials have also launched an ambitious fundraising campaign. Residents and local businesses are invited to donate to the cause through a secure website set up specifically for the event.

Officials will dedicate the memorial in a special ceremony with the Cherry Hill Police and Fire Departments the morning of Sept. 11 - the 10th anniversary of the attack.

"I am so pleased with what we have planned for this site," Platt said. When completed, it will serve as a beautiful, heartfelt addition to our community's landscape - a most fitting tribute to those who lost their lives that September day. I look forward to seeing this dream become a reality, and I hope the entire Cherry Hill community will come together to help us dedicate it this fall."

Searchable database of ordinances, resolutions now available online

Residents in Cherry Hill now have first-hand access to more than 150 years of municipal ordinances and resolutions, thanks to the launch of the Township's first Web-based, searchable archive system earlier this spring.

Located on the Township's Web site, www.CherryHill-NJ.com, this searchable repository gives residents the ability to browse local laws dating back to 1844 - the year the municipality was founded, as Delaware Township.

"Throughout my tenure as Mayor, one of my main priorities has been moving the Township further into the 21st century; leveraging new technology to make Town Hall more accessible to the more than 70,000 people who call Cherry Hill their home," Platt said.

With just a few clicks of the mouse, residents, businesses and historians alike can take a trip back in time, through more than a century of governance in Cherry Hill. Whether they're looking at a resolution from 1844 establishing a fund to pay

for sheep killed by dogs, or they're searching for the most up-to-date noise regulations, visitors to this site can see where the Township has been and where it's going.

This comprehensive database will be updated with new ordinances and resolutions after each Township Council meeting, generally held the second and fourth Monday of each month, so residents have access to the most updated information possible.

Visitors to the site should note that resolutions from 1935 to 1986 are not yet available, but are forthcoming.

"Browsing through these archives will shine an unprecedented light on the creation of Delaware Township; its changeover to Cherry Hill some 50 years ago; and its remarkable evolution from an agrarian society into the bustling, commercial spine of South Jersey we see today," Platt said.

This is the latest technological upgrade made at Town Hall in the last year, Platt

added. For example, in 2010, the Township installed GPS in its fleet of Public Works vehicles, helping to maximize staffing efficiency in that department. The Recreation Department also successfully launched online registration for all Township-sponsored courses and classes, allowing families to sign up for seasonal offerings without having to travel to Town Hall.

Platt said he and Council are continuing to explore additional ways to use both the Web and new, emerging technologies to make the Township more accessible to residents - including exploring the possibility of implementing online payments for things like property tax and sewer bills.

"It has always been my belief that a good government uses technology to operate more efficiently and effectively - to become more convenient and more transparent for its stakeholders, the taxpayers, and I'm looking forward to sharing our advances in the weeks and months to come."

Looking Back...

at Early Ellisburg Village

Though Delaware (Cherry Hill) Township was primarily farmland, several smaller villages including Batesville and Colestown, developed throughout the town to serve the local populace.

The most populated village within Delaware Township was Ellisburg, which was ideally situated at the well-traveled intersection of Old Marlton Pike (Route 70) and Kings Highway. The village was named for the Ellis Family, the original settlers of the area.

In the early 1800s, Isaac Ellis built his "General Store" to accommodate the local populace as well as the many travelers passing through Waterford Township en route to the larger villages

of Medford, Camden, Moorestown, Haddonfield and Salem. The General Store was demolished in 1938 to make way for the Ellisburg Circle.

The Ellis Family donated a portion of their land to accommodate a new schoolhouse and municipal government. The small, two-story building served many functions in early days of Delaware Township, including the Township library, prison and police headquarters. A new, larger Town Hall was built at its current location on Mercer Street in 1965. A McDonald's now occupies the Ellisburg site.

It's been a busy spring for the Green Team this year! With a number of public events and a significant amount of organizational planning the Green Team is ready to take on sustainability issues in the Township.

The spring started with the adoption of the new Green Action Plan, highlighted in the Winter Recreation Guide. Township Council adopted the new Green Action Plan on March 28, 2011 and also recognized the efforts of Sustainable Cherry Hill by honoring them with a proclamation recognizing March 28, 2011 as Sustainable Cherry Hill Day.

We followed up the Green Action Plan with "Celebrate Our Planet" at the Cherry Hill Mall, reaching an audience from the entire South Jersey region and highlighting all of the efforts undertaken by

the Township, Sustainable Cherry Hill, the school environmental groups and other organizations from our region toward creating a more sustainable region. There were also a number of choral performances from our local schools. 

Doing laundry is most likely part of your everyday routine, but did you know how important taking care of your clothes dryer is to the safety of your home? Fires which began in clothes dryers account for 4% of total structure fires within the US annually. This translates to approximately 17,000 home fires each year. The leading cause of dryer fires was the ignition of lint that accumulated within or around the dryer. With a few simple safety tips you can help prevent a clothes dryer fire within your home.

- Do not use the dryer without a lint filter.
- Make sure you clean the lint filter before or after each load of laundry. Remove lint that has collected around the drum.
- Rigid or flexible metal venting material should be used to sustain proper air flow and drying time.
- Make sure the air exhaust vent pipe is not restricted and the outdoor vent flap will open when the dryer is operating. Once a year, or more often if you notice that it is taking longer than normal for your clothes to dry, clean lint out of the vent pipe or have a dryer lint removal service do it for you.
- Keep dryers in good working order. Gas dryers should be inspected by a professional to make sure that the gas line and connection are intact and free of leaks.
- Make sure the right plug and outlet are used and that the machine is connected properly.
- Follow the manufacturer's operating instructions and don't overload your dryer.
- Turn the dryer off if you leave home or when you go to sleep for the night.
- Assure you have a working smoke detector on the same level of your home as the clothes dryer.

Registration process

- ♦ Township offices are open Monday-Friday, 9 a.m.-5 p.m.
- ♦ If registering online, Visa and Mastercard are accepted
- ♦ If registering in person or by mail, a registration form must be properly filled out, signed and submitted with your payment

 - Please submit separate checks for each program
- ♦ All ticket sales must be paid for in person or by mail - credit cards are not accepted at this time

Registration deadlines

Unless noted, the registration deadline for all programs is one week prior to the start of the first class. Registration will still be accepted after the deadline, but some are subject to a \$15 late registration fee.

Non-Residents

- ♦ A \$10 non-resident fee is required for each class
- ♦ Residents are given first priority to register
- ♦ Free courses are limited to Cherry Hill residents, except for senior line dancing and ceramics which require a non-resident fee each semester.

Waiting lists

Waiting lists are a source of contact and do not guarantee you will receive a call back. You will be contacted only if a space becomes available. If notified of an opening, you will have 24 hours to accept the space (with payment) or the opening will be offered to the next person.

Why separate checks?

You may register all family members on the same form, but please submit separate checks for each program. If one program is full, submitting separate checks will allow us to return your check for the canceled program, but register the rest of your family. It's for your convenience.

Code of Conduct

Participants are expected to exhibit appropriate behavior at all times while participating, spectating, or attending any program or event sponsored by Cherry Hill Township. Failure to observe the Code of Conduct, may result in your removal from a program without refund.

Registration waiver

Registration forms must be signed by the participant. If the participant is a minor, the form must be signed by a parent or guardian. Class is to be attended by the registrant only. Parents and siblings are not permitted to stay in class with children unless the curriculum is designed for that purpose.

Confirmations

You will be notified if your registration is not accepted; otherwise you should attend the first scheduled class.

Cancellations/Refunds

- ♦ Cancellations or transfers must be made 7 days before the class begins
- ♦ Refunds will not be given after the first day of class except in the case of injury or illness. Written documentation from a physician is required.
- ♦ Refunds are subject to a \$15 processing fee
- ♦ Courses canceled due to inclement weather or instructor absence will be made up at the end of the session

Instructions for completing the Universal Child Health Record (CH-14)

Section 1 - Parent

Please have the parent/guardian complete the top section and sign the consent for the child care provider/school nurse to discuss any information with the health care provider.

The WIC box needs to be checked only if this form is being sent to the WIC office. WIC is a supplemental nutrition program for Women, Infants and Children that provides nutritious foods, nutrition counseling, health care referrals and breast feeding support to income eligible families. For more information about WIC in your area call 1-800-328-3838.

Section 2 - Health Care Provider

1. Please enter the date of the physical exam that is being used to complete the form. Note significant abnormalities especially if the child needs treatment for that abnormality (e.g. creams for eczema; asthma medications for wheezing etc.)

- ♦ **Weight** - Please note pounds vs. kilograms. If the form is being used for WIC, the weight must have been taken within the last 30 days.
- ♦ **Height** - Please note inches vs. centimeters. If the form is being used for WIC, the height must have been taken within the last 30 days.
- ♦ **Head Circumference** - Only enter if the child is less than 2 years.
- ♦ **Blood Pressure** - Only enter if the child is 3 years or older.

2. **Immunization** - A copy of an immunization record may be copied and attached. If you need a blank form on which to enter the immunization dates, you can request a supply of Personal Immunization Record (IMM-9) cards from the New Jersey Dept. of Health & Senior Services, Immunization Program at 609-588-7512.

- ♦ The Immunization record must be attached for the form to be valid.
- ♦ "Date next immunization is due" is optional but helps child care providers to assure that children in their care are up-to-date with immunizations.

3. **Medical Conditions** - Please list any ongoing medical conditions that might impact the child's health and well being in the child care or school setting.

a. Note any significant medical conditions or major surgical history. **If the child has a complex medical condition, a special care plan should be completed and attached for any of the medical issue blocks that follow.** A generic care plan (CH-15) can be downloaded at www.state.nj.us/health/forms/ch-15.doc. Hard copies of the CH-15 can be requested from the Division of Family Health Services at 609-292-5666.

b. **Medications** - List any ongoing medications. Include any medications given at home if they might impact the child's health while in child care (seizure, cardiac or asthma medications, etc.). Short-term medications such as antibiotics do not need to be listed on this form. Long term antibiotics such as antibiotics for urinary tract infections or sickle cell prophylaxis should be included. PRN Medications are medications given only as needed and should have guidelines as to specific factors that should trigger medication administration.

Please be specific about what over-the-counter (OTC) medications you recommend, and include information for the parent and child care provider as to dosage, route, frequency, and possible side effects. Many child care providers may require separate permission slips for prescription and OTC medications.

c. **Limitations to physical activity** - Please be as specific as possible

and include dates of limitation as appropriate. Any limitation to field trips should be noted. Note any special considerations such as avoiding sun exposure or exposure to allergens. Potential severe reaction to insect stings should be noted. Special considerations such as back-only sleeping for infants should be noted.

- d. **Special equipment** - Enter if the child wears glasses, orthodontic devices, orthotics, or other special equipment. Children with complex equipment needs should have a care plan.
- e. **Allergies/sensitivities** - Children with life-threatening allergies should have a special care plan. Severe allergic reactions to animals or foods (wheezing etc.) should be noted. Pediatric asthma action plans can be obtained from The Pediatric Asthma Coalition of New Jersey at www.pacnj.org or by phone at 908-687-9340.
- f. **Special diets** - Any special diet and/or supplements that are medically indicated should be included. Exclusive breast feeding should be noted.
- g. **Behavioral/Mental Health issues** - Please note any significant behavioral problems or mental health diagnoses such as autism, breath holding or ADHD.
- h. **Emergency plans** - May require a special care plan if interventions are complex. Be specific about signs and symptoms to watch for. Use simple language and avoid the use of complex medical terms.

4. **Screening** - This section is required for school, WIC, Head Start, child care settings and some other programs. This section can provide valuable data for public health personnel to track children's health. Please enter the date that the test was performed. Note if the test was abnormal or place an "N" if it was normal.
- ♦ For lead screening state if the blood sample was capillary or venous and the value of the test performed.
 - ♦ For PPD enter millimeters of induration, and the date listed should be the date read. If a chest x-ray was done, record results.
 - ♦ Scoliosis screenings are done biennially in the public schools beginning at age 10.

This form may be used for clearance for sports or physical education. As such, please check the box above the signature line and make any appropriate notations in the Limitation to Physical Activities block.

5. Please sign and date the form with the date the form was completed (note the date of the exam, if different).
- ♦ Print the health care provider's name.
