## A Message from Mayor Chuck Cahn



The first one hundred days of my administration have been busy, exciting, rewarding, and productive. While the work continues, I wanted to recap some of the promises kept as we reach this milestone and highlight some of the progress made in this short time.

Throughout my campaign, I pledged to serve as a full time Mayor because, based on my business experience, I believe our residents and businesses deserve someone with a sole focus on Cherry Hill. In just the first one hundred days, we held over two hundred meetings on issues important to Cherry Hill residents and businesses. Those meetings included conversations with our Police and Fire Chiefs, as well as with our Religious, Civic and Athletic leaders. During these first hundred days, myself, members of Council, and Township Administrators have attended more than fifty events around the Township, including gatherings hosted by many of our civic and community organizations. While attending each event, I have heard feedback and suggestions from both residents and businesses alike about ways to improve the Cherry Hill community. From the campaign trail to taking the oath as Mayor, I promised to conduct a line-by-line examination of the budget, reassess Township departments, and review the way our government conducts business in an effort to identify potential savings. That budgetary review, a long and in-depth process, is well underway

and has already sparked initial changes. In the coming months, we will continue to develop ways that Cherry Hill can change government and identify potential savings. As a crucial part of this financial review, the Administration identified areas for increased streamlining of our operations to provide better service to residents and businesses alike. The first step in streamlining took place when the Township Council took action to combine our planning, zoning, and construction departments under the departmental umbrella of Community Development. We have already received extremely positive feedback in response to this change. We also pursued greater diversity and increased representation on the Township's Planning and Zoning Boards, along with our Municipal Prosecutors.

I have also expanded our efforts to aggressively identify and pursue alternative funding sources and offset expenses. I am proud to report that Cherry Hill has applied for over \$700,000 in grant monies, and we continue to pursue every opportunity for additional funding. Of that, we have already been approved to receive over \$320,000 to assist with community development, public safety, public works, and recreation activities. In addition, the Township explored various shared service opportunities with the County and neighboring towns. Throughout the Mayoral Campaign, I reiterated the importance of improving the relationship between the Township and Cherry Hill Public Schools. Superintendent Reusche and I have already built a strong relationship, engaging in monthly meetings and regular events together. We have begun to explore opportunities for the Township to provide support to our schools through additional shared

service agreements. The open communication has allowed Dr. Reusche and I the opportunity to work closely to ensure Cherry Hill's funding continues to go to our public schools. I held meetings with elected officials in Trenton, where I advocated for legislation to provide local approval before a charter school could open in a municipality. Along with improving our relationship, I have had the pleasure of visiting most of our schools to talk with students and with our PTA's. I have been vocal about increasing transparency and expanding communications throughout the Township. Through our newly redesigned website, visitors can easily find bids, agendas, board members, resolutions, proclamations, ordinances, events, and even my public schedule. In our newest attempt to improve communication, the Township joined in a shared service with Camden County to utilize a Reverse 911 system. We have also expanded our social media usage and enhanced electronic communications including the Mayor's Weekly email.

I also promised to expand participation in our government with new initiatives. I promoted the establishment of the Citizens and Business Councils to increase community leadership and involvement. We are about to hold our first Citizen's Cabinet meeting, which saw an overwhelming response from residents looking to get involved. We are now in the process of creating a Business Council, to develop an incubator for collaboration between the Township and local business leaders. We are also preparing to launch the Mayor's Wellness Campaign, to improve the health, wellness, and safety of the entire community.

While we have already fulfilled many promises and started to make progress, there is still a long road ahead, with many more stops along the way. I hope you will continue to provide your suggestions and assistance as we make decisions to determine the future of our Township. Thank you for allowing me to serve as Mayor of this great town!

## Cherry Hill welcomes several new businesses

Economic development and redevelopment are important initiatives under Mayor Cahn's administration. Before the end of March, Mayor and Council have helped Burlington Coat Factory, Spring Hills Senior Communities, and Farmers Insurance open their doors in Cherry Hill. Even more notable is the fact that both Burlington Coat Factory and Spring Hills Assisted Living are housed within existing structures. Burlington Coat Factory occupies what was the original Home Depot location while Spring Hills Assisted Living repurposed the Clarion Hotel on Route 70.

### Spring Hills Senior Communities



Mayor Cahn and Councilwoman Kane attended the Ribbon Cutting and Grand Opening of Spring Hills Senior Communities. The opening marked a milestone in the renaissance of this Route 70 landmark site, which was formerly a hotel and conference center.

This innovative flagship community in Cherry Hill sets a new standard in luxury senior living, featuring high-end amenities for the residents, including a Signature Touches program, which aims to enhance the lives of Spring Hills' residents through a holistic approach focused on mind, body and spirit.

### Burlington Coat Factory

Together with Councilman Bannar and Councilwoman Kane, Mayor Cahn joined employees, executives and shoppers at



Burlington Coat Factory for their ribbon cutting and grand opening. The new store is located in the Garden State Pavilions on Route 70. Burlington Coat Factory hosted a job fair in Cherry Hill Township before opening and estimates the store has added approximately 100 jobs to our community. In addition to the ribbon cutting, Burlington Coat Factory also hosted Charity Day - a celebration of charity, community and new jobs the same day. Shoppers received special offers in return for a donation to their local charity of choice.

### Farmers Insurance

Farmers Insurance is the newest business



member to join the Garden State complex on Haddonfield Road. Mayor Cahn and Councilwoman Shin-Angulo cut the ribbon for the new offices, which are part of an aggressive East Coast expansion for Farmers Insurance, the nation's third largest property and casualty insurance provider. The company is opening offices in the state of New Jersey for the first time in its eighty-four year history. The company's Agency Point office is located in the Garden State Park, directly above Nordstrom's Rack.

At each meeting, our Planning Board is reviewing applications for new development within Cherry Hill Township. Mayor and Council are committed to rebuilding and revitalizing the business community and excited about what that regrowth will mean for our town.

In addition, Mayor Cahn has been meeting regularly with Cherry Hill business owners to identify opportunities for streamlining processes in an effort to make Cherry Hill Township an ideal development location.

## Cherry Hill begins utilizing Reverse 911 System

Cherry Hill has begun sharing services and utilizing Camden County's Reverse 911 Community Notification System as an additional tool to alert residents of important and significant Township messages. The Reverse 911 System allows for rapid telephone notification Township-wide or to specific geographical areas of the Township. The system will be used for important Township alerts only, including but not limited to emergency evacuations, missing person alerts, natural disaster alerts, hazardous material leaks, search and rescue operations, crime prevention, neighborhood emergency incidents, special community notifications and Homeland Security information.

Our first phone call was distributed in March, and informed residents of an imposter alert being disseminated by the Cherry Hill Police Department. The Reverse 911 system will automatically place a call to residential landline telephone numbers within a specific geographic area and will deliver the relevant recorded message. If phone lines are busy, the system will attempt to redial those numbers to make contact. If an answering machine or voicemail system picks up the call, the emergency message will be left on the machine/voicemail. When you get a Reverse 911 call, you will receive specific instructions on what to do, where to go, or how and where to obtain additional information. ## Fire Commissioner Kelly takes oath of office



On Monday, April 16, Mayor Cahn joined friends, family, firefighters, and fire officials at the Cherry Hill Fire Department Central Command building on Marlkrass Road to swear in new Fire Commissioner William Kelly for a three-year term.

Established by Cherry Hill voters in 1993, the Board of Fire Commissioners is the governing elected body charged with providing fire and emergency services for the citizens of Cherry Hill. The Fire Commissioners have set very high goals for the Cherry Hill Fire Department based on the premise that the citizens of Cherry Hill are customers, and therefore deserve the best fire and emergency medical protection available. The main areas of focus are protection, prevention, education, and patient care.

## Celebrating Greek Independence Day



In March, Mayor Cahn joined Councilmembers Amato, Bannar and Kane in a celebration of Greek Independence Day at Town Hall. Members of the Greek community walked from St. Thomas Greek Orthodox Church to Town Hall for a flag raising and ceremony commemorating the day. The children sang songs, members spoke and the Mayor presented a proclamation with Council members marking this special day.

## Cherry Hill announces 'Project Medicine Drop' to help fight prescription drug abuse

This past April, New Jersey Attorney General Jeffrey S. Chiesa joined Cherry Hill Police Chief Rick DelCampo and Mayor Chuck Cahn to announce an important step in continuing the fight against prescription drug abuse.

The Township has partnered with the Division of Consumer Affairs as they expand "Project Medicine Drop," a statewide initiative to help everyday citizens join the fight against the abuse of addictive, deadly prescription drugs.

Under Project Medicine Drop, Cherry Hill Township has installed a lockable, metal "prescription drug drop box" outside of the Police window at Town Hall. Cherry Hill residents are invited to come in and use the boxes 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year, to dispose of their unused and expired prescription medications.

"Prescription painkiller abuse sends thousands of New Jersey residents into addiction treatment each year, and kills more Americans than cocaine and heroin combined. We are fighting this problem with targeted investigations and enhanced tools to detect 'pill mills' and 'doctor shopping,'" Attorney General Chiesa said. "Today, by expanding Project Medicine Drop, we are inviting New Jerseyans to join us in this fight. At the Cherry Hill Police Department and other sites throughout the state, you can drop off your unused medications safely, securely, and responsibly."

This simple but important step helps keep excess medications from falling into the hands of those who might abuse them, or sell them for abuse. It also helps protect the environment – as it keeps harmful medications from being flushed into the water supply.

Today's expansion of the program includes a new partnership with Covanta, a Mor-

ristown-based operator of energy-from-waste and renewable energy facilities. The company will destroy the medications at no cost to taxpayers, thus potentially saving the police departments thousands of dollars each year.

"We're not just helping consumers get excess medications out of their homes. We are encouraging New Jerseyans to think differently about their prescription medications – including how to use them responsibly and talk to their family members about the dangers of abuse," Eric T. Kanefsky, Acting Director of the New Jersey Division of Consumer Affairs, said.

Commissioner Bob Martin said, "The DEP strongly supports this initiative, which will provide a secure and environmentally sound method of prescription drug disposal, and one that will help protect our water supply."

Cherry Hill Police Chief Rick Del Campo said, "The Cherry Hill Police Department is proud to lead this initiative in our county, and to help residents take an active role in the effort to keep unused medications from being abused, and from polluting the environment."

Project Medicine Drop is one component of the Division of Consumer Affairs' comprehensive effort to halt the diversion and abuse of prescription drugs.

## Stockton Elementary School named a New Jersey School of Character, sixth in Cherry Hill District

Stockton Elementary School is the latest Cherry Hill Public School to be named a New Jersey School of Character.

According to reviewers, Stockton's application "showed high levels of implementation of the Eleven Principles of Effective Character Education."

"These principles are guidelines for creating a character development culture in a school," explained Mona Noyes, the District's Character Education Coordinator.

"Building that culture requires diligent involvement and thoughtful planning and implementation of all who make up a school community. Needless to say, it not only drives achievement, but helps to develop character in our young people."

Stockton principal Eloisa DeJesus-Woodruff congratulated the school's Character Education Committee, led by Nick Baldoni and Lauren Turk, "for their dedication in implementing our school-wide character education initiatives." She also thanked the School Leadership Council and the entire Stockton School community.



Based on its selection as a NJ School of Character, Stockton's application will now be considered by the Character Education Partnership (CEP) in Washington, D.C. in the National Schools of Character program.

Since 2008, six Cherry Hill schools have

been named NJ School of Character award winners: Carusi Middle School, Beck Middle School, Johnson Elementary School, Horace Mann

Elementary School, Woodcrest Elementary School, and Rosa International Middle School. Carusi received National School of Character honors in 2011 and 2008, respectively. The Alternative High School was named an Emerging School of Character in 2011. In addition, a number of Cherry Hill schools have received Honorable Mention in the NJ Schools of Character program.

Cherry Hill's Character Education Initiative is a partnership of the administration, Board of Education, Cherry Hill Education Association, and Cherry Hill Zone PTA.

## Student Government Day



This year's Student Government Day offered top high school students from Cherry Hill High School West and East the opportunity to participate in local government, while providing the Township with the perspectives and insight of our community's future leaders. 
Thanks to the efforts of the Cherry Hill Township staff, the Green Team, and the Cherry Hill Environmental Advisory Committee, Cherry Hill has been recognized with a Certificate of Environmental Stewardship from the State of New Jersey. The Environmental Stewardship Program was initiated in 2008 by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection's Compliance and Enforcement program. It recognizes sites or communities that engage involuntary actions which exceed existing regulatory requirements and result in a positive benefit to the environment. There are 21 stewardship categories and Cherry Hill received recognition in eight of those categories. In the Environmental Policy category we received recognition for our Green Grounds and Maintenance Policy which includes and Integrated Pest Management strategy. We re-

ceived recognition for completing a Community Carbon Footprint as part of our It's In Our Power program which also received recognition in the Outreach Program category. The lighting upgrades at the Municipal Building were recognized in the Green Building Category, the compost program in the Material Conservation category, and the solar panels in the Renewable Energy Use Category. Finally, our No-Mow Program received recognition in both the Environmental Enhancement Category and as an Innovative Program.

While we do not engage in these activities for recognition, rather to improve our environment and conserve Township resources, we are honored to be selected by the State as an Environmental Stewardship Community. It is also important to recognize the hard work and effort put forth everyday by the Township staff and our community partners for helping us achieve this level of success!

Project Medicine Drop is a program designed to allow Township Residents to properly and safely dispose of their unwanted or expired household medications.

Residents can bring their unwanted or expired household medications removed from the original packaging and in a zip lock or similar type plastic bag to the Cherry Hill Police Department, 820 Mercer Street Cherry Hill, NJ 08002, 24 hours a day and place their medications into the Project Medicine Drop box anonymously and free of charge. The medications will then be safely and properly destroyed.



- ◆ Properly use and dispose of hazardous products, which may include household or commercial cleaning products, lawn and garden care products, motor oil, antifreeze, and paints;
- ◆ Do not pour any hazardous products down a storm drain. Storm drains are connected to local waterbodies and the water is not treated;
- ◆ If you have hazardous products in your home or workplace, make sure you store or dispose of them properly;
- ◆ Use natural or less toxic alternatives when possible;
- ◆ Recycle used motor oil;
- ◆ Do not let sewage or other wastes flow into a stormwater system;
- ◆ Don't litter--place litter in trash receptacles;
- ◆ Recycle, recycle, recycle!
- ◆ Participate in community cleanups.

### Easy Things You Can Do to Protect Our Water

As a resident, business or other member of the New Jersey community, it is important to know these easy things you can do every day to protect our water.

#### Limit use of fertilizers & pesticides

- ◆ Do a soil test to see if you need a fertilizer.
- ◆ Do not apply fertilizers if heavy rain is predicted.
- ◆ Look into alternatives for pesticides.
- ◆ Maintain a small lawn and keep the rest of your property or yard in a natural state with trees and other native vegetation that requires little or no fertilizer.
- ◆ If you use fertilizers and pesticides, follow the instructions on the label on how to correctly apply it. Properly store or discard any unused portions.

#### Clean up after your pet

- ◆ Pet owners or their keepers are required to pick up and properly dispose of pet waste dropped on public or other people's property.
- ◆ Township ordinance requires you to: use newspaper, bags or pooper-scoopers to pick up wastes; dispose of the wrapped pet waste in the trash or unwrapped in a toilet; never discard pet waste in a storm drain.

**Don't feed wildlife**, such as ducks and geese, in public areas.

#### Dispose of yard waste properly

- ◆ Keep leaves and grass out of storm drains.
- ◆ Use leaves and grass clippings for compost.
- ◆ Use a mulching mower that recycles grass clippings into the lawn.

### Pet Waste Pollutes Our Waters

Clean and plentiful water is important to our families, our environment, our economy and our quality of life.

Did you know that animal waste from pets can pollute our waters? When left on the ground, pet waste is washed by rain and melting snow and ice into storm drains that carry it to our rivers, lakes, the ocean and drinking water.

Animal waste contains a high concentration of nutrients, bacteria and disease-causing microorganisms that can cause problems.

Pet owners or anyone who takes your pet for walks must properly dispose of waste by picking it up, wrapping it and either placing it in the trash or flushing it unwrapped down the toilet.

At a minimum, pet owners or their keepers should immediately and properly dispose of their pet's solid waste deposited on any public or private property not owned or possessed by that person. People with assistance animals are exempt.





# Instructions for completing the Universe Child Health Record (CH-14)

## Section 1 - Parent

Please have the parent/guardian complete the top section and sign the consent for the child care provider/school nurse to discuss any information with the health care provider.

The WIC box needs to be checked only if this form is being sent to the WIC office. WIC is a supplemental nutrition program for Women, Infants and Children that provides nutritious foods, nutrition counseling, health care referrals and breast feeding support to income eligible families. For more information about WIC in your area call 1-800-328-3838.

## Section 2 - Health Care Provider

1. Please enter the date of the physical exam that is being used to complete the form. Note significant abnormalities especially if the child needs treatment for that abnormality (e.g. creams for eczema; asthma medications for wheezing etc.)

- ♦ **Weight** -Please note pounds vs. kilograms. If the form is being used for WIC, the weight must have been taken within the last 30 days.
- ♦ **Height** -Please note inches vs. centimeters. If the form is being used for WIC, the weight must have been taken within the last 30 days.
- ♦ **Head Circumference** - Only enter if the child is less than 2 years.
- ♦ **Blood Pressure** - Only enter if the child is 3 years or older.

2. **Immunization** - A copy of an immunization record may be copied and attached. If you need a blank form on which to enter the immunization dates, you can request a supply of Personal Immunization Record (IMM-9) cards from the New Jersey Dept. of Health & Senior Services, Immunization Program at 609-588-7512.

- ♦ The Immunization record must be attached for the form to be valid.
- ♦ "Date next immunization is due" is optional but helps child care providers to assure that children in their care are up-to-date with immunizations.

3. **Medical Conditions** - Please list any ongoing medical conditions that might impact the child's health and well being in the child care or school setting.

a. Note any significant medical conditions or major surgical history. **If the child has a complex medical condition, a special care plan should be completed and attached for any of the medical issue blocks that follow.** A generic care plan (CH-15) can be downloaded at [www.state.nj.us/health/forms/ch-15.doc](http://www.state.nj.us/health/forms/ch-15.doc). Hard copies of the CH-15 can be requested from the Division of Family Health Services at 609-292-5666.

b. **Medications** - List any go ongoing medications. Include any medications given at home if they might impact the child's health while in child care (seizure, cardiac or asthma medications, etc.). Short-term medications such as antibiotics do not need to be listed on this form. Long term antibiotics such as antibiotics for urinary tract infections or sickle cell prophylaxis should be included.

PRN Medications are medications given only as needed and should have guidelines as to specific factors that should trigger medication administration.

*Please be specific about what over-the-counter (OTC) medications you recommend, and include information for the parent and child care provider as to dosage, route, frequency, and possible side effects. Many child care providers may require separate permission slips for prescription and OTC medications.*

c. **Limitations to physical activity** - Please be as specific as possible and include dates of limitation as appropriate. Any limitation to field trips should be noted. Note any special considerations such as avoiding sun exposure or exposure to allergens. Potential severe reaction to insect stings should be noted. Special considerations such as back-only sleeping for infants should be noted.

d. **Special equipment** - Enter if the child wears glasses, orthodontic devises, orthotics, or other special equipment. Children with complex equipment needs should have a care plan.

e. **Allergies/sensitivities** - Children with life-threatening allergies should have a special care plan. Severe allergic reactions to animals or foods (wheezing etc.) should be noted. Pediatric asthma action plans can be obtained from The Pediatric Asthma Coalition of New Jersey at [www.pacnj.org](http://www.pacnj.org) or by phone at 908-687-9340.
